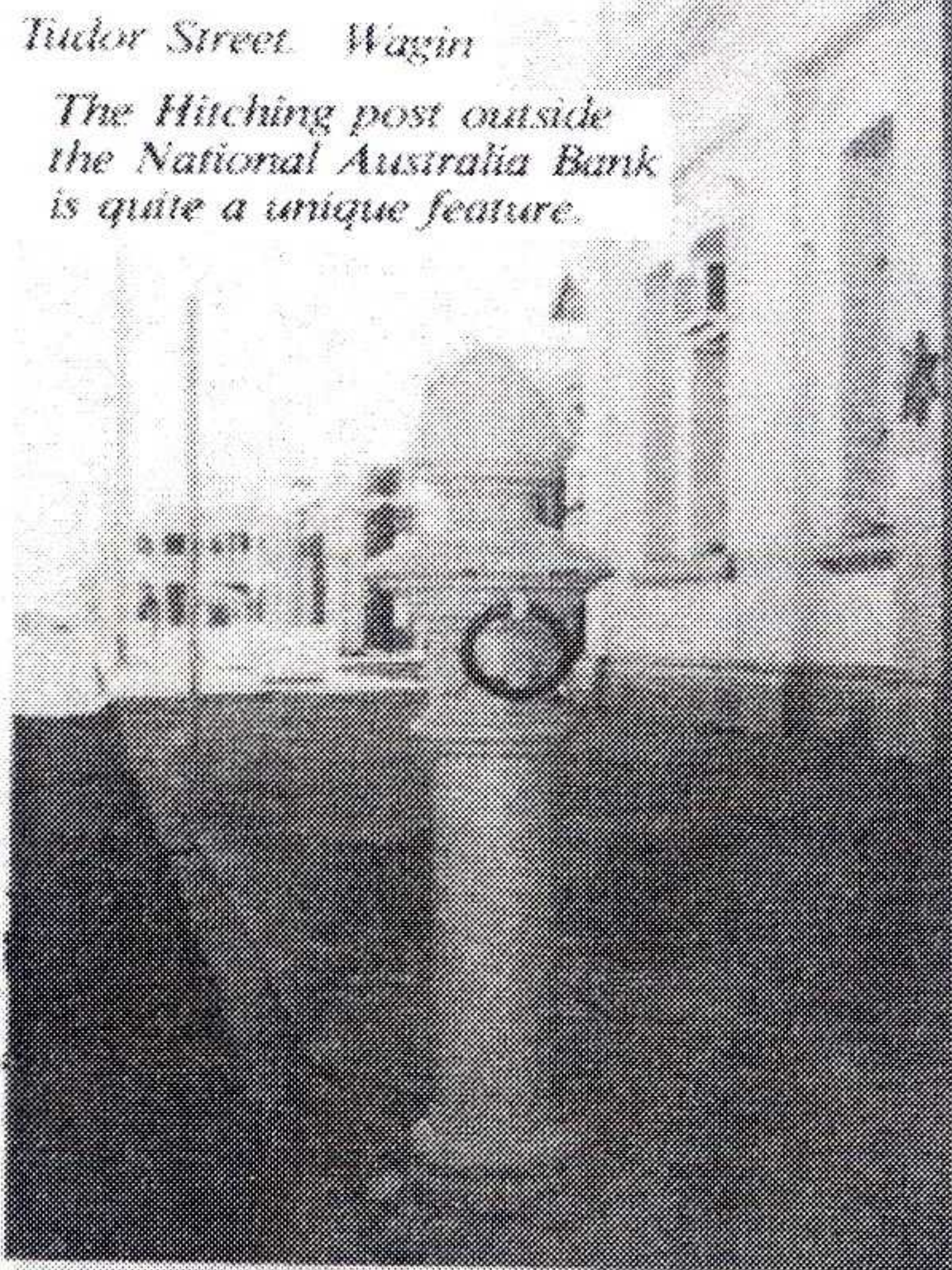


Bound copies of "A Walk Around Wagin" by Lloyd Nelson

The Hitching post outside the National Australia Bank is quite a unique feature.



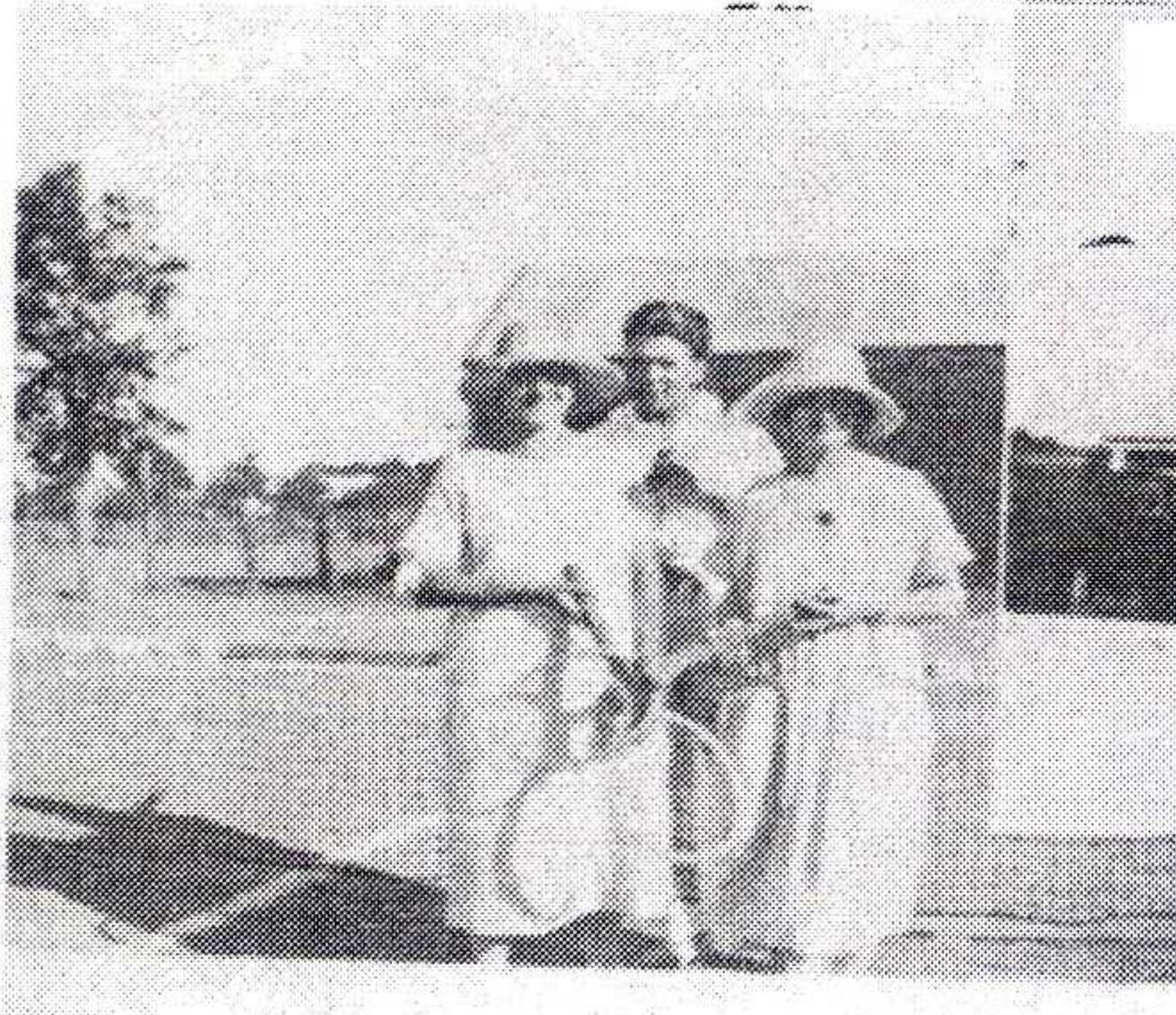

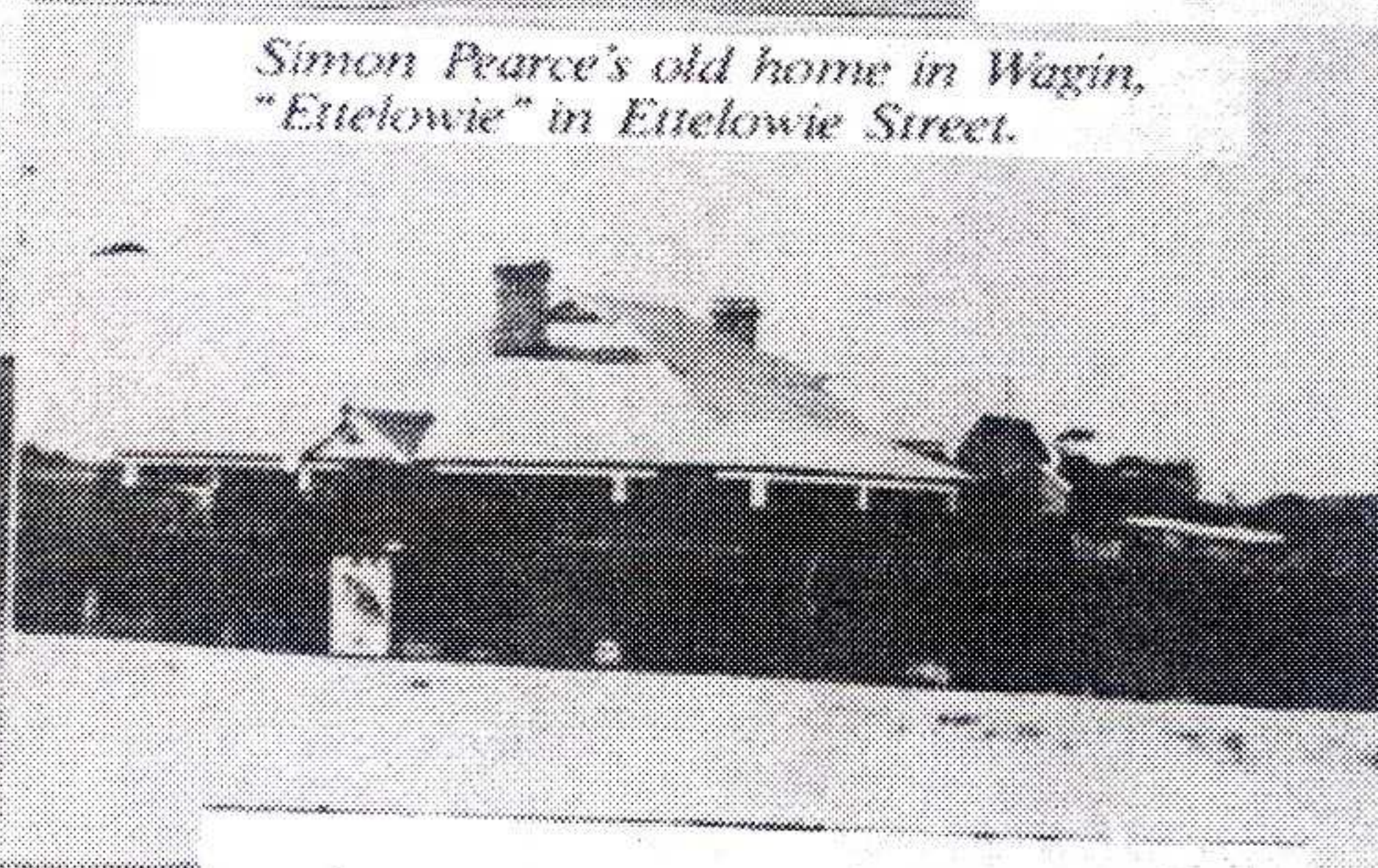
"Condinning Hill" sighted by Roe north of Wagin.
